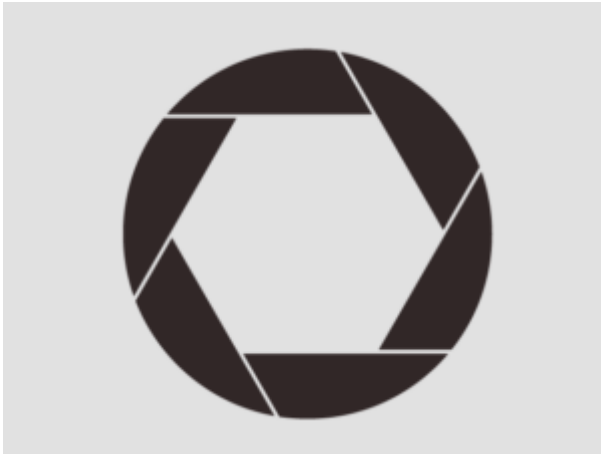


# Picture This! Right Place, Right Time
