General Shop Safety

Tools

Tools are an important investment and should be kept clean and organized for quick inspection and location with each use. This includes your wrenches, an open-ended wrench that is loose, or a twelve-point box wrench with worn teeth that could slip and cause damage to one's hands/arms, so care should be made to make sure they are properly discarded. It is easier to avoid hand injury from scraping a sharp object if one pulls toward yourself rather than pushing away.
